



Preface

This volume contains the proceedings of the conference “Groups & Algebras in Bicocca for Young algebraists” (GABY 2022), that took place at the University of Milano – Bicocca, Italy, from June 13 to 17, 2022 (originally scheduled for 2020 and postponed due to the covid emergency). This is the second edition of the conference, which was held for the first time in 2018 with the aim of initiate a series of biennial conferences dedicated to young researchers in algebra.

GABY 2022 was attended by more than 70 young algebraists, from several different countries, including Armenia, Belgium, England, France, Germany, India, Italy, Israel, Poland, Portugal, Spain. It offered a friendly environment to share mathematical ideas, but also to think over important aspects of everyday life, thanks to the E.D.I. The Editors believe this volume will be beneficial for early career mathematicians, who need to get familiar with a new topic and with the open questions related to it, and also for experts in the field, who can easily trace here some long-known results and recent developments in the subject.

The proceedings are edited by the non-profit association “AGTA — Advances in Group Theory and Applications”, which

the Editors thank for the opportunity to publish the volume and start a collaboration that hopefully will turn this volume into the first one in a long series of proceedings serving as surveys on various topics of algebra.
